ABOUT THE PANELISTS



Danny Quah is Li Ka Shing Professor in Economics and Dean at the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy, NUS. His research on inequality and income mobility characterises the range of experiences across economies to suggest that a single narrative on inequality is unlikely to be correct or helpful. His work on world order takes an economic approach to international systems, studying the supply and demand of world order: what international system do the world's superpowers wish to provide; what world order does the global community need? Quah uses this to recast analysis of global power shifts, the rise of the east, regional order, and models of global power relations. Quah is a member of the Spence-Stiglitz Commission on Global Economic Transformation. He is the author of "The Global Economy's Shifting Centre of Gravity".

Guiying Laura Wu is an Associate Professor in Economics at School of Social Sciences, NTU. Laura obtained her Bachelor's Degree in Economics from Fudan University and D.Phil. in Economics from University of Oxford. Her current research centers on the effects of various distortions and frictions on firms' investment and financing behavior and their implications to economic development and resource allocation. Laura also has a particular interest in Chinese economy from the perspective of industrialization, urbanization and globalization. Her research papers have been published in leading academic journals such as Journal of Development Economics, Journal of International Economics, Oxford Bulletin of Economics and Statistics, and China Economic Review. Laura also serves as the Associate Chair in academic at the School of Social Sciences, and as an Associate Editor for the journal Economic Modelling.



Paul Schulte is the founder of Schulte Research, established in 2012 researching financial institutions and technology. He has spent 3 decades on financial research and worked for all 3 branches of the US government, including the NSC at the White House. He currently teaches in 3 universities, has written 5 books and authored hundreds of articles. He has worked for the Number 1 investment bank from US, UK, Japan, China & Switzerland starting in 1990, focusing on technological change in banks & insurance. He has been a source for the WSJ, NYT, Bloomberg, Nikkei, FT, Economist, Barron's and Forbes. His clients include some of the largest sovereign, pension, mutual and hedge funds globally. His latest book is "The Race for 5G Supremacy: Why China is Winning, Where Millennials Struggle & How America Can Prevail (2020)".
