Professor Lee Soo Ann entered the University of Malaya as an undergraduate in 1956. He then taught in the University of Malaya in Singapore, followed by the University of Singapore, and subsequently at the National University of Singapore (NUS) at the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy, the Department of Business Administration, and the Department of Economics. He also taught at Nanyang Technological University (NTU) as an adjunct professor in the College of Commerce, and more recently at Singapore Management University (SMU) as an adjunct fellow. His two most recent books are “Singapore: From Place to Nation” (Pearson 4th edition 2019) and “God and Money” (Bible Society of Singapore, 2019). Prof Lee was Economic Adviser to the United Overseas Bank and was on the board of two of its subsidiary companies. He also sat on the board of the Jurong Town Corporation, the Port of Singapore Authority, the National Productivity Board, and at the board of trustees of the University of Singapore.



Professor Arnoud De Meyer is a Professor Emeritus and former President of Singapore Management University. He is an internationally recognised researcher in R&D and Innovation Management, Manufacturing Strategy and International Management. Currently he is Chair of the Temasek sponsored Stewardship Asia Center (Singapore) and an independent director of several listed companies. He recently published “Ecosystem Edge: Sustaining Competitiveness in the Face of Disruption” and “Building Excellence in Higher Education: Singapore’s Experience”



Dr Michael Syn is a Senior Managing Director & Head of Equities SGX Group. Mr Syn has management responsibility for SGX equity businesses, serving as CEO of the stock market (SGX-ST), depository (CDP) and futures market (SGX-DT/DC).
